Big - His size and strength may feel a bit impractical to manage at times



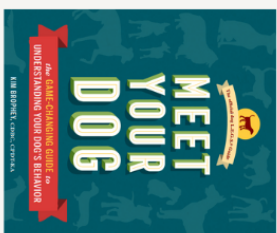
You might find yourself seeking professional help for:
